REPORT OF OFFICES AND SPECIAL GUESTS

A. Staff Reports (informational only)

Brenda Bach - WWTP

• Water Department-

- o The water tower project for the most part has been finished, but there are some issues that are being addressed with the contractor on top of the tower and around the base. The inspection report is being reviewed and as soon as it is available I will have more info.
- O We have been working on the control valves at the tower and we have a malfunctioning altitude pilot valve. We have rebuilt the control valve that opens and closes the main line to the tower and still need to do maintenance on the 10" valve on the main line. We will be rebuilding the Altitude Pilot valve as well. We also have been informed that the sensing line for the altitude pilot valve is installed incorrectly and it will need to be addressed. As far as I know since 2007 that the sensing line has been in the same place as it is now, and it has probably been malfunctioning to a degree ever since the bi-pass line was installed before 2007. We are having a valve expert familiar with this type of system and we will know more after it's inspected.

• Cross Connection Control Department-

 No new news, inspections ongoing and records updated. With an addition of photos being added to all cross-connection locations within the City limits.

• Wastewater Department-

- We have finished the lift station maintenance at the high school and at the end of Benton Street and all are well with their operation.
- We have started inspecting all the sewer man holes with in the city, and have very few minor issues in the 43 manholes so far. And we are updating our city maps as well, which is always a work in progress.
- o General maintenance at the plant is always ongoing with fall oil changes and replacing belts on our list. We have some equipment that is out in the elements that will be getting ship shape before winter hits. We have computer operated/actuator valves that are out in the elements controlling the sewer coming in, and the clean water going out, that are showing a little age but are in great working condition. We are keeping spare parts on hand for those unexpected breakdowns, which is important to keep the plant running 24/7.

- Councilmember Gilmour inquired about the sign asking for volunteer fire personnel. Mayor Whitford said she would get the banner for Councilmember Gilmour to place.
- Councilmember Gilmour invited Councilmembers to attend the School Board Meeting on September 20th to ask for the school to allow the fiddlers back. Mayor Whitford and Councilmember Camarata cannot attend as they have a COG meeting. Councilmember Smith said she would attend with Councilmember Gilmour.
- Councilmember Gilmour informed Council that the fiddlers had been coming to the City of Kittitas for 20 years and they attend workshops and also perform at different times for the citizens.
- Councilmember Gilmour inquired about Fellowship of the Vine taking care of the weeds by the Community Hall/Library. Councilmember Gilmour said he could come cut them down.
- Council asked about what the status was of the painting of the water tower. Mayor Whitford
 informed Council that they are complete but there was a small punch list that needed
 completed.
- Councilmember Cort told Council that at the work study meeting they need to make a 5 year plan and add the tasks of new computers, asset management, server etc. to the calendar and project a time when these items would be completed and could be budgeted for.
- Councilmember Smith inquired if there was money for the computers, it was stated that there was money budgeted for a new server.
- Councilmember Cort stated that the City had gotten several bids but they were not apples to apple bids. It was agreed that Councilmember Cort and Councilmember Smith would meet next week and make a bid package together of what exactly the City needs. If this list was made then the City could also possibly apply for a grant to help with the purchase.
- Councilmember Smith asked if there were vendors for Christmas in Kittitas. Councilmember Cort stated that yes there were and that they used the Council Chambers to sell their crafts.
- Councilmember Smith is trying to get some volunteers for Trunk or Treat, Christmas in Kittitas. Councilmember Smith stated that the new owners of the coffee barn are going to decorate a car for Trunk or Treat.
- Councilmember Smith would like Council to put together a list of questions for Chief Sinclair

regarding the merger of the fire department.

• A hand out from MRSC was given to Council regarding campaigning and posting opinions on social media.
