Wastewater Department-

- Aug 17 on a Saturday, Kurin was called in to fix a manhole backup. Water ended up on a resident's lawn. Monday following, I was made aware. I called ecology to report and to find out my/our responsibilities. I spoke to the homeowner with Scott.
- I followed up with a formal report, per our permit. This needed to be in within 5 days. I fulfilled that requirement. A few days later, ecology contacted me again wanting to know if I had reported to department of health, I had not. The homeowner had contacted DOE/ maybe even DOH.
- I was not aware I needed to do so. I was then informed... should the sewer backflow get into drinking water supply that would have been necessary. Since in the case, that had not happened we did as we were supposed to.

- Pumptech here again on Aug 29, went into school lift station and fixed the plumbing issue. Working on setting floats has been an ongoing issue.
- The roving operator for the department of ecology here on Sept 23, asked if he was able to take few short videos for training purposes. Made a point to not show me or where he was in videos.

Lynette Johnson – Librarian

- Barcoding of our non-fiction books is just about complete. As we are working on that, we are rearranging books in the non-fiction room and creating a Northwest History and Local History section. We still have some of those to barcode along with reference material. Next up will be books on CD and then we can start cleaning up our database to make sure we haven't missed anything and also remove anything that was put in a long time ago that we no longer have on the shelves.
- Instead of having a trunk during Trunk-or-Treat, we will once again be handing out candy in the library at the same time. There are still people in our community that have never been to the library and this is a way of getting them to come in to see what we have. This is also our goal when Santa comes during Christmas in Kittitas. We have also started our preliminary planning for that event as well. We will once again be handing out free books to the kids that come in to see Santa thanks to a grant from Legends Casino.
- We also want to remind people that along with all the books in our library, through the
 Washington State Anytime Library, our patrons have access to thousands and thousands of ebooks and audiobooks. Anyone that wishes to use the Anytime Library can request to be added
 and then they have full access to the collection through our Washington State Library. This
 works with apps on computers, tablets, smart phones and there are also Kindle versions of most
 e-books.
